WELCOME TO MADRONE

The Barony of Madrone (pronounced “Ma-DRO-nah”) is a local chapter of the Society for Creative Anachronism (SCA), in the Kingdom of An Tir (Welsh for “The Land”). The Barony covers the area modernly known as Seattle and northern King County, in Washington state. The Eastside of this area is known as the Canton of Porte de l’Eau, a sub-branch of Madrone.

The SCA is an international non-profit volunteer educational organization. We are devoted to the research and re-creation of pre-seventeenth century skills, arts, combat, culture, and employing knowledge of history to enrich the lives of participants through events, demonstrations, and other educational presentations and activities.

SCA EVENTS

An SCA event is where like minded people gather for activities. We often attempt to recreate the ambiance of an Earlier Age by bringing pavilions, furniture, and other gear to spend a day or a weekend at an indoor or outdoor location. An event usually does not have a specific historic period focus, so you will see people who are dressed in pre-seventeenth clothes from across the world, such as those that might be worn by a Roman of the 100s, a Mongol of the 1300s, a Persian of the 1500s or a Spaniard of the 1600s.

Membership is not required for participation, and you don't have to have a costume – we call it garb – before you come to your first few events. We can loan you clothing to wear from our fine collection called Gold Key.

MADRONE AND PORTE DE L'EAU EVENTS

The Barony of Madrone & the Canton of Porte de l'Eau hosts several events a year.

- March – Rogue's Tavern – a low key event with a setting of a tavern at a crossroads where there is music, games, bards and "rogues." The Baronial Bard is selected/appointed at this event.
- Spring/Summer – Sven's Event – a no-cost event held on the Eastside, where the battle croquet champion is decided.
- May – Lionhearts – a martial event where the Baronial champions in Rapier and Heavy weapons are decided.
- June – Athenaeum – an Arts and Sciences event where artists and artisans from around the kingdom display their work/research/period and talk to all who are interested in speaking with them!
- Summer – Peasant's Revel – a no-cost event held at a public park in Seattle, with rolling and chasing wheels of cheese.
- Late Summer/Autumn – Emprise of the Black Lion – an equestrian centered event sponsored by the Barony. Alternates yearly with
